Hydrofilm® Roll is a self-adhesive film dressing for fixation of primary wound dressings it is made of semi-permeable, waterproof polyurethane film, transparent; protect against bacterial penetration; with hypoallergenic adhesive, can be removed painlessly without leaving any residues. Hydrofilm® Roll is non-sterile dressing and can be cut to the needed length.

Hydrofilm® Roll carries the CE mark according to EU directive 93/42/ EEC for medical devices. The product is classified as a class I (non-sterile) medical device. A conformity assessment has been performed for Hydrofilm® Roll and it has been shown to be in compliance with all applicable requirements of the above mentioned directive. The safe use of Hydrofilm® Roll therefore, is ensured if the product is used in line with the intended purpose.

### 2. Application / Indication

Hydrofilm® Roll is a protective layer for the fixation of primary wound dressings, e.g. to cover gel-forming calcium alginate dressings.

Hydrofilm® Roll should not be used on clinically infected, bleeding or highly exudating wounds
